The goal is the same as a fully able skier; slide down the hill on one or two skis learning to make turns with outriggers or poles, as appropriate. Sometimes the instructor must use a tether. Of course, at the end of the run, the participant must make controlled and successful stops! The most satisfying part of the lesson is to see the smile and excitement on the participant's face! Seeing the joy in the parents of child participants at the end of the lesson is the icing on the cake. It makes all the effort worth it! Everyone goes home with a sense of accomplishment excited to participate in the next lesson. That includes everyone: the participants, the instructors and all the volunteers.
